Greetings to my TWC family! It is with profound joy and pride that I greet you in the matchless name of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ. In 2025, we took the spiritual mandate to “Be Bold” in our kingdom journey. We accomplished much with courage and faith in the face of fear and uncertainty. As always, I am very appreciative to you for allowing me to be your servant. Each year brings different challenges and 2025 was no exception, but we overcame them all. We experienced natural and spiritual victories and for that I am grateful. During this year, we continued our monthly kingdom community giveaway, launched “Bundles of Joy” diaper giveaway, added a nursing home ministry, implemented the Young Women of Excellence & Boys Leadership Camp youth ministries, started a military personnel ministry, began volunteer of the month recognition, remodeled building space to create a Prayer Room, donated \$2,000 to COCIC charities in support of 2025 California Wildfires Disaster Relief, 10 were baptized, 39 new members added to our family, closed our budget with a significant surplus, and most importantly gained strength, tenacity, grit, and confidence to complete the business of the kingdom. Together, let us be thankful for how far we have come and gracious enough to move to our “Next Level” in ministry!

God is Not Finished!

Jason Nelson's gospel anthem "Otherside" delivers a powerful message of encouragement, reminding us that no matter what challenges we face, God has a greater purpose and a future filled with joy awaiting us. The song reassures listeners that tough times are temporary—meant to strengthen our faith—and that when God's work in our lives is complete, we will emerge refined and victorious.

The song's five core messages stand out. First, Divine Purpose: God is not finished with you. He has a plan for your life, a plan for you to overcome and experience true joy. Second, Testing and Growth: The struggles you face are tests intended to deepen your faith and build your strength. Third, Endurance and Trust: Even amid life's storms, keep your focus on God and trust Him to guide you through. Fourth, Future Victory: The promise of being refined "like gold" points to a future where, after enduring trials, you will shine with the strength and beauty God has cultivated in you. And finally, Hope and Assurance: The repeated chorus "I can see you on the other side" offers hope—a confident declaration that a better, brighter future is just ahead.

True faith often means trusting before we fully understand—believing now what will make sense later. The story of Lazarus in John 11:1-44 powerfully illustrates this. When Lazarus died, Mary and Martha were heartbroken, feeling as if all hope was lost. Yet, Jesus had a greater plan. He waited, allowing Lazarus to die, so He could reveal His authority over death and His power to restore life in every sense.

Upon arriving in Bethany and witnessing the grief of Lazarus's loved ones, Jesus was deeply moved. He approached the tomb and called Lazarus out—restoring him to life after four days in the grave. This miracle was not about physical resurrection; it was about restoring hope, joy, and faith to those who believed. Jesus is the ultimate restorer. He does not merely fix what is broken; He transforms it, bringing us to a place better than before. His restoration reaches beyond what we have lost, offering even more than we could imagine—healing not only our bodies, but our souls.

When we encounter situations that feel hopeless or overwhelming, when darkness surrounds us, remember: Jesus can bring restoration. He can turn despair into hope, darkness into light, and death into new life. Trust that God is not done with you yet. "I can see you on the other side—and you look even better than you do right now!" Since April 2020, from January through November, we have consistently served our community by distributing boxes of groceries, new household items, and clothing. This year, we launched Bundles of Joy providing free diapers and wipes to families in need.

Missions and Evangelism partnered with our Health and Wellness Ministry to host a comprehensive community outreach, offering backpacks and school supplies, free health screenings, haircuts, nutritious food, a group workout session, and engaging activities for children and families.

In October, our youth participated in a Day of Service, ministering to individuals and families at Our House. Our Dress for Success clothing donation drive was highly successful, supplying professional and business attire to young men attending HBCUs in Pulaski County, Arkansas.

In November, we distributed boxes of chicken, ham, and full Thanksgiving meals during our annual Thanksgiving Giveaway. Additionally, our Christmas Miracles in McAlmont initiative was a tremendous success, blessing more than 100 families with toys and winter coats during the Christmas season.




MEN


